From our Principal Mr Michael Gavaghan

Dear Parents & Carers,

As we complete the first full week of 2024, I can say it's been a very settled start with routines being established and the students responding accordingly. Thank you to the staff for your hard work and expertise in helping each child to settle back into school.

Yesterday we gathered in St Andrew's church to celebrate mass to open the school year. Fr Albert was the presiding priest and he gave a blessing to the students for the year ahead. I was very proud of the way our students conducted themselves so reverently and our choir, under the leadership of Susanne Sweeney, helped make the liturgy a joyous occasion. I especially want to acknowledge our Year 5 students who are buddying our new Foundations, they took their buddies to mass to assist them in understanding the expectations for gathering in church. Well done Year 5.

Specialist programs began this week. On specialist day students are required to wear their sports uniform. Years 5 & 6 Specialist Day is Tuesday, Years 3 & 4 Specialist Day is Wednesday and Years F-2 have their specialist day on Thursday.

Next Wednesday is Ash Wednesday, this day marks the beginning of the season of Lent for Christians. Lent is a period of 40 days that leads into Holy Week and the celebration of Easter. The children will be learning about Lent and its meaning in their RE lessons. Next Wednesday the Year 3-6 students will attend mass at 9:00am with the parish, please have the children here by 8:50 so they are ready for the start of mass. The Year F-2 students will have a liturgy in school, where they will also receive the ashes.

2024 Statements were distributed to families this week.

CSEF & Concessional School Fees

Families with a valid, current health care card are eligible to apply for the Camps, Sports, Excursion Funding and concessional school fees.

The CSEF is paid to schools by the State Government to eligible students. Each eligible student is entitled to \$125 towards camps, sports and excursions.

Concessional fees for eligible students is:

- 1 child family \$ 780.00
- 2 child family \$1196.00
- 3+child family \$1560.00

Eligible families must complete an application form, available from the school office, and present their valid, concession card with their completed application form to the school office.

Direct Debit Payments

Families wishing to establish direct debit payments and those families needing to re establish their direct debit arrangements for 2024 can do so by visiting or contacting the school office.

Morning Routines

School Gates open each morning at 8:30am. Students enter classrooms at 8:50am Classes begin at 9:00

Teachers are on duty from 8:30 -9:00 am School gates are locked from 9:00am -3:15pm

The time before school is a passive time, school playgrounds are closed and out of bounds. This decision was made a few years ago to ensure students entered classrooms in a calm and centred state, ready for learning.

NAPLAN

Students in Years 3 & 5 participate in NAPLAN (National Assessment Program - Literacy & Numeracy). This year's NAPLAN will be held between 13 - 25 March. At St Andrew's the following test program will be followed:

Wed 13 March 9:30am - Writing

Mon 18 March 9:30am - Reading

Tues 19 March 9:30am - Numeracy

Wed 20 March 11:30am - Language Conventions

Parents are asked to keep these dates and times in mind when making other arrangements. If a student is unable to take a test at the designated time with a valid reason then make up times are available.

Overdressing Your Child

There is no doubt that we want our little ones to be comfortable and warm when they head out the door, but remember that they are going to school which means they will be moving around a lot.

During Terms 1 & 4 we ask that students wear full Summer uniform. This means that it is not necessary to add layers under school shirts (boys) and dresses (girls). Children, particularly in the younger years are unable to control their body temperature and as such are at risk of overheating.

Some tips to guide you:

- Two layers of clothing in the warmer months are ideal. For example school shirt or dress followed by a school jumper.
- Allow your child to practice putting on and taking off their school jumper.
- Encourage your child to drink water throughout the day.


