CSEF & Concessional School Fees

Families with a valid, current health care card are eligible to apply for the Camps, Sports, Excursion Funding and concessional school fees.

The CSEF is paid to schools by the State Government to eligible students. Each eligible student is entitled to \$125 towards camps, sports and excursions.

Concessional fees for eligible students is:

- 1 child family \$780.00
- 2 child family \$1196.00
- 3+child family \$1560.00

Eligible families must complete an application form, available from the school office, and present their valid, concession card with their completed application form to the school office.

Students in Years 3 & 5 participate in NAPLAN (National Assessment Program - Literacy & Numeracy). This year's NAPLAN will be held between 13 - 25 March. At St Andrew's the following test program will be followed:

Wed 13 March 9:30am - Writing

Mon 18 March 9:30am - Reading

Tues 19 March 9:30am - Numeracy

Wed 20 March 11:30am - Language Conventions

Parents are asked to keep these dates and times in mind when making other arrangements. If a student is unable to take a test at the designated time with a valid reason then make up times are available.

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL)

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) is a whole-school framework that promotes positive behaviour across our school and helps us to develop safe and supportive learning environments.

Our behaviour matrix explicitly outlines school-wide expectations to ensure our students are safe, respectful and responsible. Our staff ensure all students are explicitly taught the expected behaviours and establish clear and consistent boundaries. Staff take a proactive, preventative approach to ensure all students receive the appropriate level of support to help them to be successful at school.

Let's work together - Before school is an opportunity where our students and families can come in and make connections with the school community. It is a time when our children can meet with their friendship groups before the day begins. Our children respond very well to calm routines.

One way we maintain calmness is by asking our students not to play on the play equipment. We ask that you support us in this decision.

Please use the following time as a guide:

8:30 - School gates open

During this time we have 2 teachers on duty to supervise designated areas. We do not allow ball games during this time or play on the playground. Some tips for our children while they are waiting for their classroom to open:

- Read a book on a bench
- Sit with friends and talk about your morning
- Say hello to the teacher on duty
- Talk to a friend you haven't seen in a while
- Make a new friend

8:50 - classrooms open - enter safely, respectfully and responsibly into your classroom by:

- Walking
- Talking quietly
- Keep hands and feet to yourself

9:00 - Gates close and teaching begins
