

Teachers will incorporate these evidence-based techniques into their lesson plans, fostering a more engaging and enriching learning environment.

Throughout the year our teachers will join with teachers from many other Catholic primary schools throughout the western region to learn and improve together. This initiative is part of the broader Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools' Vision for Instruction, titled Flourishing Learners. We believe that embracing the Science of Learning will empower our students to become more autonomous learners, equipped with the tools they need to succeed academically and beyond. At the beginning of 2024 St Andrew's was also identified as eligible to participate in the Mental Health in Schools program. Mental Health in Primary Schools, or MHiPS, is a partnership between the Victorian Government, the Centre for Community Child Health (CCCH) at the Murdoch Children's Research Institute (MCRI) and the Melbourne Graduate School of Education (MGSE) at the University of Melbourne. By participating in this program St Andrew's has been funded to appoint a teacher, part time, as a Mental Health and Wellbeing Leader. I wish to congratulate Nicole Sciberras for being selected for this role for two days a week. Elwyn Blackley has been sharing the class this term as Nicole has trained.

At our latest Parent Association meeting the discussion turned to parking and safety around our school. I wish to remind all parents to abide by the parking regulations in place. I especially wish to highlight Mortimer St, outside the Foundation classrooms. Between 8:15am - 9:15am & 3:00pm - 4:00pm cars should not enter Mortimer St from Werribee St, it becomes one way. Enter from Greaves St Nth and exit via Werribee St.





I also ask that cars are not parked on the nature strips and driveways of the Penola Hub, the parish building next to the school. Parking inspectors patrol the area and they will book you.

Finally, just a reminder that dogs are not permitted on the site of St Andrew's Primary School. We have students and staff who have phobias and fears of dogs so please respect our request not to bring dogs on site unless authorisation is given.

CSEF & Concessional School Fees

Families with a valid, current health care card are eligible to apply for the Camps, Sports, Excursion Funding and concessional school fees.

The CSEF is paid to schools by the State Government to eligible students. Each eligible student is entitled to \$125 towards camps, sports and excursions.

Concessional fees for eligible students is:

- 1 child family \$780.00
- 2 child family \$1196.00
- 3+child family \$1560.00

Eligible families must complete an application form, available from the school office, and present their valid, concession card with their completed application form to the school office.

Families wishing to establish direct debit payments and those families needing to re establish their direct debit arrangements for 2024 can do so by visiting or contacting the school office.

Students in Years 3 & 5 participate in NAPLAN (National Assessment Program - Literacy & Numeracy). This year's NAPLAN will be held between 13 - 25 March. At St Andrew's the following test program will be followed:

Wed 13 March 9:30am - Writing

Mon 18 March 9:30am - Reading

Tues 19 March 9:30am - Numeracy

Wed 20 March 11:30am - Language Conventions

Parents are asked to keep these dates and times in mind when making other arrangements. If a student is unable to take a test at the designated time with a valid reason then make up times are available.


improve the mental health and wellbeing of children, with a focus on positive development. This involves building children's social and emotional skills. competencies and the creation of supportive environments.


Lenten Practices


In this season of Lent, we grow closer in relationship to God through three actions:
