Principal's Message

From our Principal Mr Michael Gavaghan

Dear Parents & Carers,

We are in the final days of Lent and on the cusp of Holy Week, the most solemn and sacred of weeks in our Catholic church's tradition. The week begins with Palm Sunday, recognising the triumphant and joyous entry into Jerusalem by Jesus and his disciples, and ending with the crucifixion on Good Friday then resurrection on Easter Sunday. How can our families prayerfully enter into this time?

I am currently at a conference with approx. 250 other Victorian Catholic Primary School principals. The conference is held every two years and brings us together for collegiality and professional learning and inspiration. In 2019 the theme was Leading with Courage, in 2022 the theme was Hope and this year it is, With Strength. We have had the privilege of hearing top quality speakers share their stories. I have been particularly moved by Craig Foster, a former Socceroo player who has more recently become a champion of anti-racism, refugees and Indigenous Australians. He was very strong on how all people who live in Australia get to share equally in all our great country has to offer. We also heard from Jelena Dokic, a former champion tennis player who has survived abuse and domestic violence inflicted by her father, to arrive at a time in her life where she describes herself as thriving. Her journey is horrendous as well as a message of triumph. Those who have seen the movie Lion, will know the story of Saroo Brierly, who at 5 years of age became separated from his family in India, survived being a young boy alone on the streets of Calcutta and finally being adopted by an Australian family and ending up in Hobart. Some 20+ years later after an exhaustive search using Google he was able to locate his home town and reconnect with his Indian family. A truly moving story. I'd love to share some of my insights with you, just ask me when you see me.


This week our Year 3 and Year 5 students completed their NAPLAN testing. I congratulate all the students for doing their best and thank the teachers for preparing them and assisting in the testing. Results will be available in a few months.

Recently, we completed a risk assessment of the dismissal practices as we have had some issues especially at **gate 3**, the gate closest to the Foundation classrooms on Mortimer St. We have a few Foundation students who require extra support at dismissal time and it is difficult when many other students 'swamp' them at the same time.

Our solution is to try to open **gate 4**, the gate near the soccer pitch on Mortimer St, at dismissal time. We ask for your assistance. We will instruct the students that we will be reserving **gate 3** for the Foundation students and their siblings. Any student from a year level other than Foundation who is not with a Foundation sibling will be asked to exit through **gate 4**. Children riding bikes will also be asked to exit through **gate 4**. This will begin next week.

Next Thursday is the end of Term 1, students will be dismissed at 1:00pm.

2025 Foundation Enrolments are NOW OPEN!

Any families with a child who will turn 5 before 30 April 2025 should be enrolling them to start school next year.

Existing families will are encouraged to complete an Enrolment Enquiry online any time from March 1 until the end of Term 1.



CSEF & Concessional School Fees

Families with a valid, current health care card are eligible to apply for the Camps, Sports, Excursion Funding and concessional school fees.

The CSEF is paid to schools by the State Government to eligible students. Each eligible student is entitled to \$125 towards camps, sports and excursions.

Concessional fees for eligible students is:

- 1 child family \$ 780.00
- 2 child family \$1196.00
- 3+child family \$1560.00

Eligible families must complete an application form, available from the school office, and present their valid, concession card with their completed application form to the school office.

Families wishing to establish direct debit payments and those families needing to re establish their direct debit arrangements for 2024 can do so by visiting or contacting the school office.

Mila and Kiara represented the school with proud leadership in St Patrick's Cathedral. Walking in the procession with the school banner was a really proud moment for us. After this we sat behind the altar with other schools to listen to all of the prayers and the songs that were read and sung.

The Mass

It began with two men in kilts who played the bagpipes to represent St Patrick's country of Ireland. Archbishop Peter Comensoli told us about a principal, Mr Rob Brennan, a secondary school principal, who had passed away. Mr Gavaghan attended his funeral while we were at mass. Secondary school students led the singing at the mass and other students read prayers. The bishop had his hands in the same position as Jesus did.

One school together with many schools

There were many other Catholic schools that were at Catholic Education Week mass. Archbishop Peter greeted all students and adults, who were seated in front, to his left and to his right. We all sat down, At Communion it felt nice walking down the aisle with students from other schools around Melbourne. It was really busy.

St Patrick's Cathedral

St Patrick's Cathedral started construction in 1858. It took almost 40 years to build and it was built because it was needed and could be afforded. The first mass was held in February 1939. St Patrick's is the cathedral church of Melbourne and Victoria. It is known as the "Mother Church" of the archdiocese itself and is dedicated to St Patrick, the Irish bishop who led the church. We were also told that underneath the Cathedral is a crypt in which past bishops are buried from many years ago.


School Uniforms - Donations
